A NEW EVOLUTION FOR QUALITY MANAGEMENT IN THE AUTOMOTIVE INDUSTRY

One of the automotive industry's most widely used international standards for quality management, ISO/TS 16949, is set to evolve with the publication of a new global industry standard by the International Automotive Task Force (IATF).

ISO/TS 16949, a technical specification for automotive sector quality management systems, was first developed in 1999 by the IATF in conjunction with ISO's technical committee for quality management, ISO/TC 176. Since then, it has risen to be one of the most widely used international standards in the automotive industry, and aims to harmonize the different assessment and certification systems in the global automotive supply chain.

In October 2016 IATF 16949:2016 will be published by IATF and will supersede and replace the current ISO/TS 16949, defining the requirements of a quality management system for organizations in the automotive industry. It will be aligned with and refer to the most recent version of ISO's quality management systems standard, ISO 9001:2015. IATF 16949:2016 will fully respect ISO 9001:2015 structure and requirements. IATF 16949:2016 is not a stand-alone quality management standard, but is implemented as a supplement to, and in conjunction with, ISO 9001:2015.

IATF will ensure continued alignment with ISO 9001 by maintaining strong cooperation with ISO, through its participation in ISO/TC176.

1st Oct 2016 : Publication of IATF 16949: 2016

1st Nov 2016 : Publication of Rules 5th Ed.

1st Jan 2017 : Publication of auditor guide

From 1st Jan 2017 au 1st Oct 2017 : Volunteer transition

From 1st Oct 2017 to 14th Sept 2018 : Mandatory transition

14 Sept 2018 : End of transition period



Transition period

- From 1st Jan 2017 to 30 Sept 2017: Volunteer sites who are ready may ask for a transition audit at the date of their « regularly » audit
- From 1st Oct 2017 to 14 Sept 2018 :All sites shall perform a transition audit at the date of their « regularly » audit



The transition audit

- The transition audit shall be the duration of a recertification audit according to the IATF Rules, section 5.2.
- The transition audit shall be a full systems audit equivalent to a recertification audit and shall comply with all requirements defined in the IATF Rules, section 6.8.
- Off-site documentation review shall be conducted prior to the transition audit, which shall include at the minimum the quality manual and procedure with all changes identified
- The Certification Body may decide to perform 0.5 additional audit days on site to collect data
- External support functions may be audited after the transition audit, if justified

The transition audit

- A (new) subsequent audit cycle starts from the last day of the transition audit and a new 3 years certificate about IATF 16949:20016 is delivered if the audit conclusion is positive.
- Note : It is allowed to issue the new certificate after the expiration date of the ISO/TS 16949:2009 if the transition audit has been made on time and all non conformities are closed within 90 days.

IATF Transition Strategy

The IATF 16949 Transition Strategy has been updated 19 June 2017 (Rev 3) to include changes to the requirement(s) for submitting documentation for the off-site documentation review. The organization is required to submit documentation to allow the certification body to conduct an off-site documentation review (see **changes in red** on page 6) in the document below.

IATF Transition Strategy

If the client does not provide the minimum required information for the off-site documentation review prior to the audit to the certification body, the audit shall not begin.

It is at the discretion of the certification body to schedule additional audit days on-site to conduct an additional in-depth review of the documentation provided by the client prior to the audit.

If the transition audit cannot be conducted within the required timeframe, the client shall start over with an initial audit.

Important FAQ about the transition

- 3 Are organizations required to conduct a management review according to IATF 16949 prior to the start of the transition audit?
- 4 Are organizations required to conduct a full internal system audit against IATF 16949 prior to the start of the transition audit?
- 7 Is a documentation review required for every site within a corporate scheme?
- 15 Can a certification body conduct separate audits for ISO 9001:2015 and the supplemental requirements of IATF 16949:2016?
